Quaking Aspen



The small leaves of this native tree tremble in the slightest breeze for a beautiful effect. It is indifferent to soil conditions, and can be found in moist, shallow, rocky, or clay soils. The bark is an attractive greenish white.

Height: 60-80' Spread: 30'

Renaissance Oasis Birch





The most drought-tolerant birch in the Renaissance Series. The juvenile bark is an outstanding red-bronze, turning white with attractive exfoliation. Dense, broad pyramidal form. Dark green leaves turn yellow in fall.

Height: 50-60' Spread: 30-40

Triumph Elm



The Triumph Elm has an upright habit with strong branching, lustrous dark green foliage and excellent disease and pest resistance. Fall Foliage is yellow.

Height: 60' Spread: 35-40'

Ivory Silk Japanese Tree Lilac



These are a most attractive, small flowering tree with cherry-like bark; They bear large creamy white flower clusters in early July. And will perform best in full sun. Compact and oval shaped, these can grow to 25' and spread to 15'.

Redmond Linden



A valuable tree for street planting,
'Redmond' has the largest leaves of the
lindens. The dense foliage is glossy green
with bright yellow autumn color.
Height; 40-60' Spread: 25-30'

Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple



Fall Fiesta Sugar Maple is has branching that is full and symmetrical. Leathery, glossy, deep green leaves are resistant to leaf tatter and leafhopper damage. A rapid grower, easy to transplant and also resistant to sun scald and frost cracks. Outstanding fall color, shows far more oranges and reds than other sugar maples. Prefers a moist yet well-drained soil. Height: 50-75' Spread: 50'

Sienna Glen Maple



This is a fast growing, hardy maple with uniform branching and a pyramidal form.

Superior to Autumn Blaze® maple in withstanding strong winds. Is considered a very good substitute for ash varieties. Beautiful fall colors! Turns yellow, orange and red in the fall. Height: 60' Spread: 40'

Tatarian Maple (Hot Wings)



The perfect maple when you don't have room for a 50-100' tree. The habit is graceful, upright and spreading. The little yellow flowers are followed by bright red samaras, hence the name Hot Wings®. The dark green foliage turns yellow to red giving the fall color expected from a maple. Height: 20-25' Spread: 18-20'

Heritage Oak



A cross between an English Oak and a Bur Oak. This oak has glossy, dark green, tatter and mildew resistant foliage. A beautiful specimen tree for the front lawn, this is a truly vigorous cultivar.

Height: 60-80' Spread: 40-50'

Northern Pin Oak



This native tree is well adapted to sandy, acid soils, but will tolerate heavier soils and more alkaline conditions than Pin oak. It is great for use as a specimen tree in lawn or boulevard plantings. The red fall color can be spectacular.

Height: 60' Spread: 45'

Northern Red Oak



The Northern Red Oak is the fastest growing oak and one of the easiest to transplant, this tree is great for street use or as a landscape tree. The foliage is dense and lustrous and leaves hang on the tree into winter.

Height: 60-80' Spread: 50'

Niobe Weeping Willow



This fast growing golden barked willow has a wide spreading canopy and long, drooping branches. Height: 50' Spread: 50'.
